Welcome

String, rope 'n' wool

Find baskets of wool/string/rope - all colours, textures, lengths, dress the space on fishing nets and lines, weave into hairnets, twist, plait and bind round arms/legs. Thread beads onto strings, dangle over instruments.

Silk worms


Coloured caterpillars and silk worms appear, feel them with fingers, see the lights glow as they wriggle around you

Zither

Hear the sound of the Gu Zheng. Play stringed instruments with fingers, chopsticks and bows. Find coloured silk and chinese fans and dance to the beautiful, haunting music.

To Do: Make your own zither with a shoe box and rubber bands. Using coloured wool make a 'string trap' and try and climb through the space or decorate wheelchairs with brightly coloured string.

Bells n Gongs...



Small bells n gongs

Find a variety of small bells n gongs, listen to the different sounds, play together, build sequences and rhythms, stop/start. Lots of listening.

Puppet

The small puppet appears to entertain you. Meet and greet him, feel his costume, see his face. Paint your own faces like his; white face-paint, black liner and red lippy.

Large bells n gongs

How different do the big ones sound? Take turns to try them all, creating haunting music. The life-size puppet appear and interacts with everyone. Become puppets on loops of elastic, explore movement qualities, tension and release

To Do: Make your own gongs (decorated aluminium trays) or ankle bells, stick bells, cup bells as below

Bamboo...



Rice

Rice for pouring, shaking, running through fingers and onto instruments. Make patterns of rice in pools of coloured light, scoop into bamboo containers, make circles and lines, pile it up and smooth it flat

Bamboo Instruments

Discover all different kinds of bamboo instruments, explore their textures and sounds, play alone or together, making bamboo music.

Mr Bamboo

Your music has awoken him, he likes it and dances while you play, then gives rice krispies and rice cakes to share.

To Do: Decorate lengths of bamboo and hang from a stick to make wind chimes, or make a bamboo snake - small pieces of bamboo threaded onto wire, or a garden container from bamboo of different heights.

Sundial...
